

Timeline of EITI implementation


From preparation to canditacy: What has the D-EITI already achieved?

Identification and Invitation of NGOs

- External feasibility study for German EITI candidature identified 26 NGOs as potential MSG members
- 30.06.2014: Federal Ministry of Economics and Technology (BMWi) sent an invitation for the 1st round table of the civil society to identified NGOs
- BMWi encouraged them to further disseminate the invitation to potentially interested actors and was open to other interested organizations

1st round table of civil society

- 14.07.2014: First get-together of representatives of non-profit-organizations, the BMWi, the German Corporation for International Cooperation (GIZ), and the EITI International Secretariat
- Spokespersons of the NGOs volunteered to selforganize and expand the self-organization in the civil society
- Goals and challenges of a German EITI membership has been phrased by the NGOs
- Plans for forming of MSG and "Transparency Summit" in autumn 2014 were made

Transparency Summit

- Took place in Berlin on 26.11.2014
- Marked the launch of preparations for Germany's EITI candidature
- Goal was to inform interested stakeholders and a wide audience about the process and to call on them to engage actively within the scope of the MSG and to gain further participation of NGOs in CSO



1st constituent meeting of the MSG

- First meeting on 10.03.2015
- CSO and the two other stakeholder groups (government, industry) appointed five representatives (and five alternates) to the MSG each in independent processes
- Civil society members were selected within the scope of an autonomous, open process
- MSG agreed on Terms of Reference of the D-EITI Secretariat and the Rules of Procedure


Representatives of civil society in multi-stakeholder group

- Four CSOs:
 - Transparency International Deutschland e.V.
 - Forum on Environment & Development, serves as umbrella NGO and represent AK Rohstoffe, a network of German CSOs working on Germany's raw material policy from a development perspective.
 - Open Knowledge Foundation Deutschland e.V.
 - Green Budget Germany (FÖS e.V.)
- Industry representatives
 - Industriegewerkschaft Bergbau, Chemie, Energie (Trade union)

How we work

- Coordination of MSG CSO members: key contact for national secretariat and the two other stakeholder groups
- Coordination rotates among the four CSOs
- Regular meetings before MSG meetings to discuss agenda items and develop joint positions and fall back positions, allocate statements
- CSO constituency sends representatives to MSG working groups on the basis of expertise/ field of interest of each CSO

Widening scope: EITI+


